

1 We gather for worship

We say together the lines in bold type

Singing, Scripture sentence, greeting, introduction or prayer

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

And also with you

Either:

Loving Lord, come to us and give us life, joy and peace, that we may praise you now with our lips and all the day long with our lives, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

or:

Restore us, Lord God of hosts: show us the light of your face, turned towards us.

Will you not give us life again: that your people may rejoice in you?

Show us your mercy, O Lord: and grant us your salvation.

Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord!

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.



2 We light the Advent candles

On the first Sunday in Advent, we light one red or purple candle and sing the first two verses of the carol; on the second we light two, and sing the first three verses, and so on until Christmas, when we light the white candle as well.

The holly and the ivy are dancing in a ring, round the berry-bright red candles and the white and shining King.

O, one is for God's people, in every age and day. We are watching for his coming. We believe and we obey. And two are for the prophets and for the light they bring. They are candles in the darkness, all alight for Christ the King.

And three for John the Baptist. He calls on us to sing: "O prepare the way for Jesus He is coming, Christ the King."

3 We confess our sins



Lord Jesus, Light of the world, blessed is Gabriel who brought good news; blessed is Mary Mother of God. Bless your Church preparing for Christmas; and bless us your children who long for your coming. Amen.


6 We affirm the faith

Let us pray with confidence to the Father:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those
who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power
and the glory are yours,
now and for ever. Amen.

As our Saviour taught us, we boldly pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
