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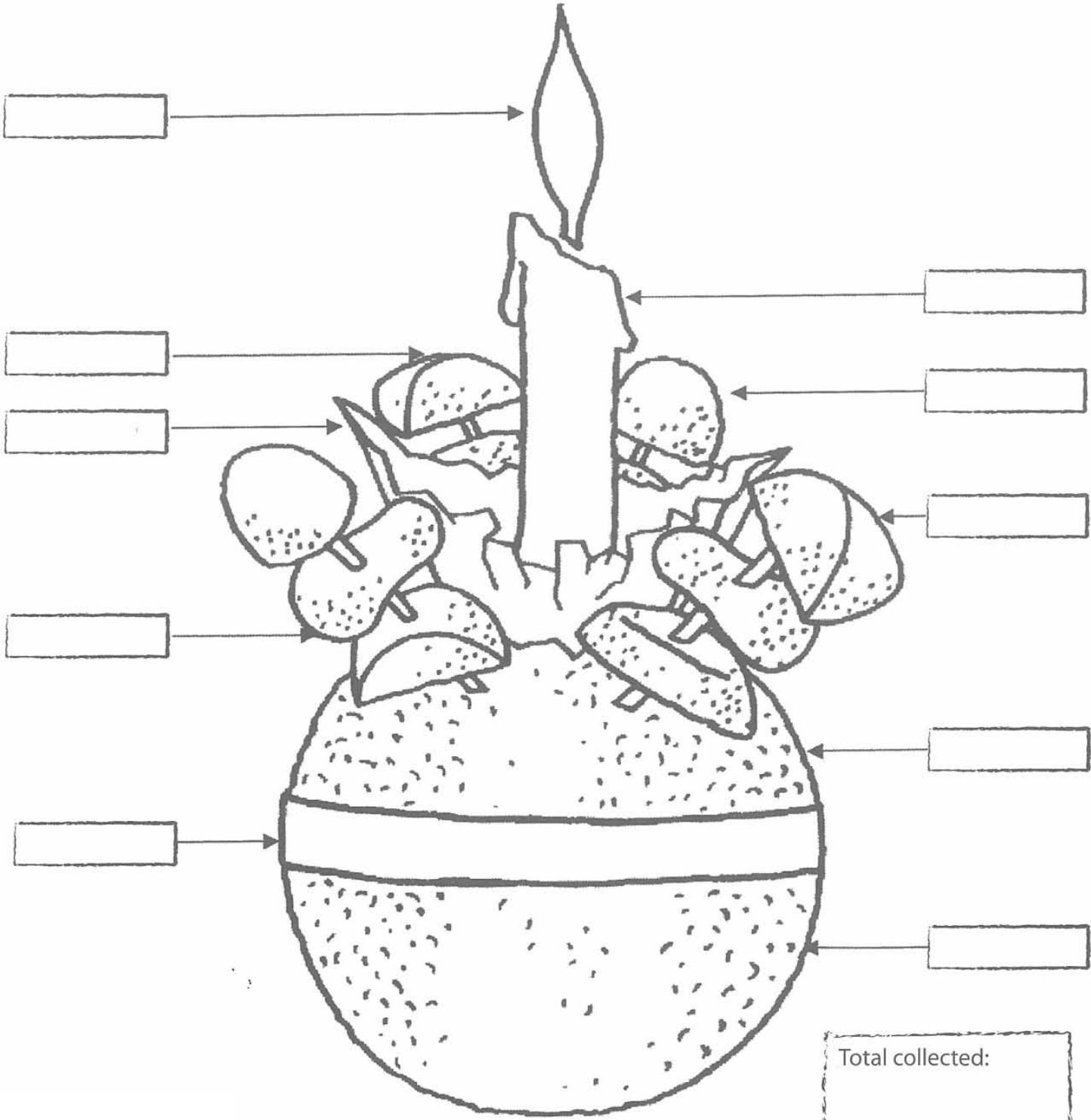

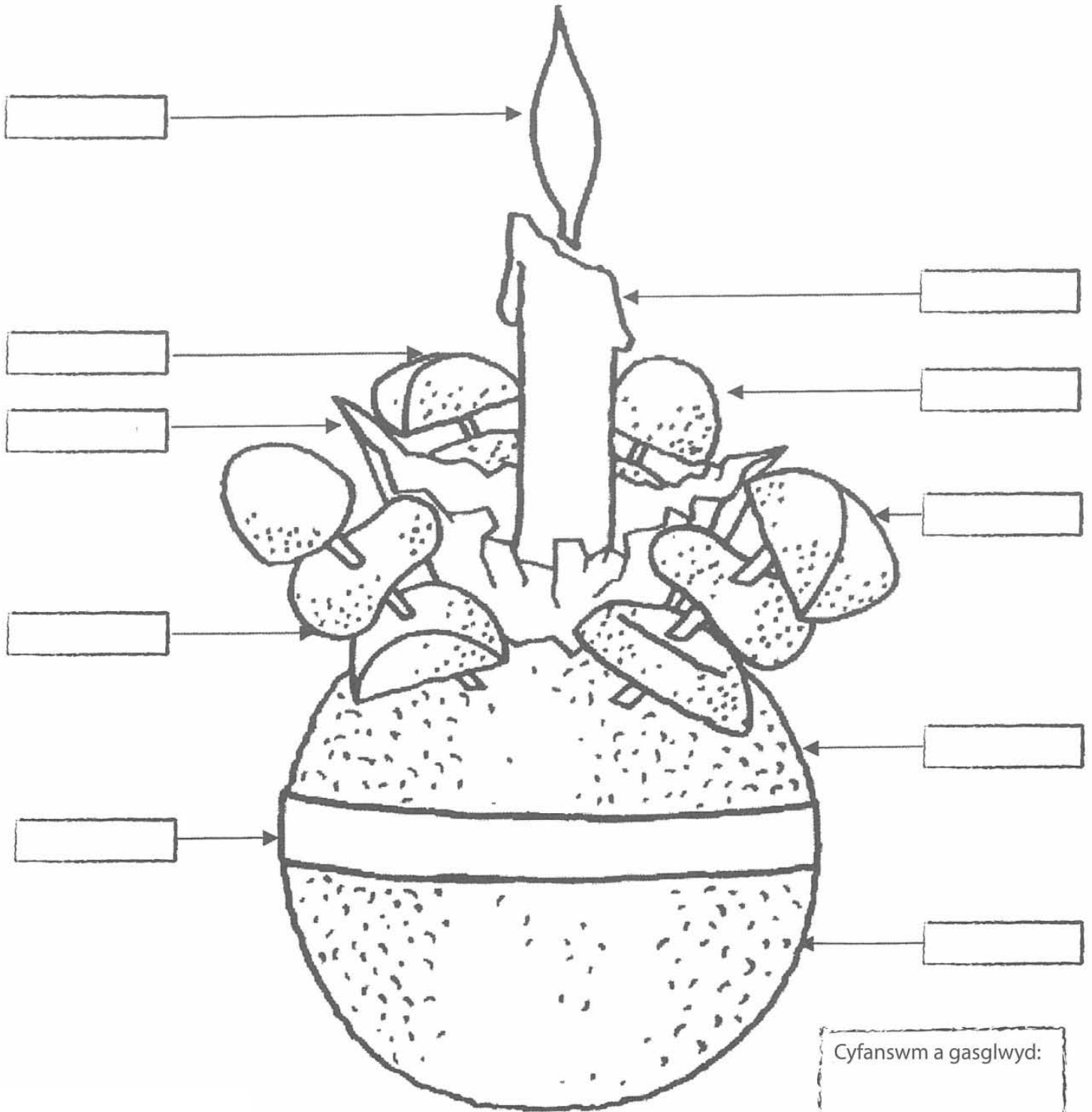

# CHRISTINGLE RESOURCE SHEET

Christingle Services are usually held any time during Advent, Christmas, Epiphany and up to Candlemas.

The word Christingle means 'Christ Light'. The Christingle originated from the Moravian Church custom of giving children lighted candles on Christmas Eve. This began in 1747 in a small church in Marienborn, Germany. The minister wanted a simple symbol to bring home the message of Christmas for the children. He came up with the idea of a lighted candle tied with red ribbon. He gave them with a prayer, 'Dear Lord Jesus, kindle a flame in these dear children's hearts.' That was the first Christingle Service. When this custom was imported into Britain, the single candle evolved into what it is today.

## A Christingle is made up of:

**A small candle** which reminds us that Jesus is the 'Light of the world'.

**An orange** which represents our world.

**A red ribbon** which stands for forgiveness, reminding us of the blood shed by Jesus on the cross.

**Four cocktail sticks with sweets, nuts and fruit** representing the four seasons and all the good things God created for us.

## The teaching emphasis is that:

- Jesus came to save the world.
- His light reaches out to all people.
- By dying on the cross, he shed his blood and saved us from our sins.
- God is generous and gave us a wonderful world with plenty of food and all we need.
- We who have plenty should not be greedy but should share what we have with those in need.



## SAFETY PROCEDURES FOR THE CHRISTINGLE SERVICE

- Extra care needs to be taken in carrying the Christingle because of the pointed sticks.
- Extreme care is needed with the lighted candle. The Christingle should be held upright and away from the face and hair of the holder and those around that person, and all papers.
- It is important to have plenty of adult stewards to avoid accidents.
- Young children - under 6 - must be accompanied by an adult when receiving their Christingle.
- Ensure that the congregation is aware of fire exits and fire procedures.



# TAFLEN WYBODAETH AM Y CRISTINGL

Fel rheol, fe fydd Gwasanaethau Cristingl yn cael eu cynnal unrhyw dro yn ystod yr Adfent, y Nadolig, a'r Ystwyll, hyd at Wyl Fair y Canhwyllau.

Mae'r gair Cristingl yn golygu 'Goleuni Crist'. Mae'n tarddu o draddodiad yr Eglwys Forafaidd o roi kannwyll wedi'i goleuo i blant ar noswyl Nadolig. Dechreuodd hyn yn 1747 mewn eglwys fechan yn Marienborn, yn yr Almaen. Roedd yr offeiriad yno eisiau symbol syml i gyflwyno neges y Nadolig i'r plant. Meddyliodd am y syniad o roi kannwyll, a rhuban coch amdani, wedi'i goleuo i bob plentyn. Cyflwynodd y rhain ynghyd â gweddi fach, 'Annwyl Arglwydd Iesu, cynnau fflam yng nghalonau'r plant annwyl hyn.' Dyna oedd y gwasanaeth Cristingl cyntaf. Wedi dechrau'r arferiad yma ym Mhrydain, fe newidiodd y syniad o un gannwyll, i'r ffurf rydyn ni'n ei defnyddio heddiw.

## Dyma beth sydd yn y Cristingl:

**Cannwyll fechan** sy'n ein hatgoffa mai Iesu yw 'Goleuni'r Byd'.

**Oren** sy'n cynrychioli ein byd.

**Rhuban coch** sy'n cynrychioli maddeuant, ac yn ein hatgoffa am waed Iesu Grist ar y groes.

**Pedair ffon coctel gyda melysion, cnau a ffrwythau arnyn nhw** i gynrychioli'r pedwar tymor a'r holl bethau da y mae Duw wedi'u creu ar ein cyfer.

## Pwyslais yr addysgu yw:

- fod Iesu wedi dod i achub y byd.
- mae ei oleuni'n llewyrchu i'r holl bobl.
- wrth farw ar y groes, fe gollodd ei waed a'n hachub ni rhag ein pechodau.
- mae Duw yn hael, ac wedi rhoi byd rhyfeddol i ni, gyda digon o fwyd a phopeth rydyn ni ei angen.
- fe ddylen ni, sydd â digon, beidio â bod yn hunanol, a rhannu'r hyn sydd gennym ni â phobl eraill sydd mewn angen.



## CANLLAWIAU DIOGELWCH AR GYFER GWASANAETH CRISTINGL

- Mae angen bod yn ofalus wrth gario'r Cristingl gan fod y ffyn coctel yn bigog.
- Mae angen bod yn hynod o ofalus gyda'r kannwyll pan fydd hi wedi'i goleuo. Rhaid dal y Cristingl i fyny'n syth ac yn ddigon pell o wyneb a gwallt yr un sy'n ei ddal, a'r bobl sydd o gwmpas, ac oddi wrth unrhyw bapurau.
- Mae'n bwysig cael digon o oedolion i oruchwylio er mwyn arbed damweiniau.
- Rhaid i blant dan 6 oed gael oedolyn gyda nhw pan fyddan nhw'n derbyn y Cristingl.
- Gofalwch fod y gynulleidfa'n gwybod ble mae'r allanfa dân, a beth yw'r drefn i'w dilyn pe bai achos o dân



# TO MAKE A CHRISTINGLE

You will need:

Large orange  
Small candle  
Silver foil  
Red sticky tape  
4 cocktail sticks  
sweets / dried fruit and raisins

- Ensure that the orange stands securely – if not slice a small piece off the bottom.
- Wrap red tape around the middle of the orange.
- Make two slits crosswise, with a knife, in the top of the orange.
- Place a circle of silver foil over the slits you have made, to trap the hot wax.
- Gently push the candle through the foil into the orange.
- Thread sweets / dried fruit and raisins onto the cocktail sticks, ensuring that the sharp point is covered.
- Fix the four completed sticks onto the orange.



## A LARGE CHRISTINGLE AS A VISUAL AID

**Orange.** Cover a blown up circular balloon with several layers of papier maché, leaving a hole (just over 1 inch in diameter) at the top end, ensuring that the base is slightly flattened so that it will stand firmly. When the papier maché is thick, firm and thoroughly dry, paint it orange. Finally, burst the balloon.

**Foil.** Cut out a large circle, to fit over the top of the orange over the central hole you have left in the papier maché. Cut a hole just over 1 inch in the centre of the circle.

**Candle.** Use a church candle (1 inch diameter) or rolled up card with an orange tissue paper flame.

**Sticks.** Use wooden kebab sticks with large pieces of coloured card fruits.

**Ribbon.** Stick a wide piece of florist ribbon around the middle.



## A LIVING CHRISTINGLE

**Candle.** Dress one child in a white t-shirt to hold a large lighted candle.

**Orange.** Dress up four children (of about the same height) in orange t-shirts. They stand in a circle around the “candle” facing outwards.

**Ribbon.** A length of florist ribbon is held by the four “oranges”.

**Sticks.** Dress up four children (of about the same height) in white or green t-shirts. Each child stretches out his or her arms holding a large vegetable e.g cabbage, cauliflower.

This Living Christingle should be built up gradually as the meaning of each part is explained.

Fe fydd amoch chi angen:

Oren mawr  
Cannwyll fach  
Ffoil coginio  
Tâp gludiog coch  
4 ffon coctel  
Melysion/ ffrwythau sych a rhesins

- Gofalwch fod yr oren yn sefyll yn ddiogel - os bydd angen, torrwrch ychydig ar ei waelod i'w wneud yn wastad.
- Rhowch y tâp coch o amgylch yr oren.
- Gwnewch doriad fel croes ar ben yr oren.
- Rhowch gylch o ffoil dros y toriad, fe fydd hwn yn dal unrhyw wêr sy'n toddi o'r gannwyll.
- Gwthiwch y gannwyll yn ofalus ar ben y ffoil i'r oren.
- Gwthiwch y melysion a'r ffrwythau sych ar y ffyn coctel, gan ofalu fod un ffrwyth yn gorchuddio'r blaen pigog.
- Gwthiwch ben arall y pedair ffon i ochrau'r oren.



## CYMORTH GWELEDOL CRISTINGL MAWR

**Oren.** Gorchuddiwch falŵn gron wedi'i chwythu gyda sawl haen o *papier maché*, gan adael twll (tua modfedd ar ei draws) ar y pen uchaf. Ceisiwch wneud y gwaelod yn weddol wastad er mwyn i'r model sefyll yn gadarn. Pan fydd y *papier maché* yn galed ac yn hollol sych, paentiwch â phaent oren. Gallwch fyrstio'r balŵn wedyn.

**Ffoil.** Torrwrch gylch mawr i ffitio dros y twll rydych chi wedi'i adael yn y *papier maché*. Torrwrch dwll tua modfedd yng nghanol y cylch ffoil.

**Cannwyll.** Defnyddiwch gannwyll eglwys (tua modfedd ar ei thraws), neu gerdyn gwyn wedi'i rollo a fflam o bapur sidan oren ar ei ben.

**Ffyn.** Defnyddiwch ffyn *kebab* gyda siapiau mawr o ffrwythau wedi'u torri allan o gerdyn lliw.

**Rhuban.** Gosodwch ddarn llydan o rhuban coch gwerthwr blodau o amgylch y model.

## CRISTINGL BYW

**Cannwyll.** Un plentyn mewn crys T gwyn, yn dal kannwyll fawr wedi'i goleuo.

**Oren.** Pedwar plentyn (tua'r un taldra) mewn crysau T oren. Maen nhw'n sefyll mewn cylch o gwmpas y 'gannwyll' yn wynebu tuag allan.

**Rhuban.** Darn llydan o rhuban coch gwerthwr blodau digon hir i'r pedwar 'oren' ei ddal yn strided.

**Ffyn.** Pedwar plentyn mewn crysau T gwyn neu wyrdd. Fe fydd pob un o'r pedwar yn ymestyn eu breichiau allan ac yn dal llyisiau mawr e.e. blodfresych, bresych etc.

Fe ddylai'r Cristingl Byw yma gael ei adeiladu'n raddol fel bydd ystyr pob rhan yn cael ei egluro.

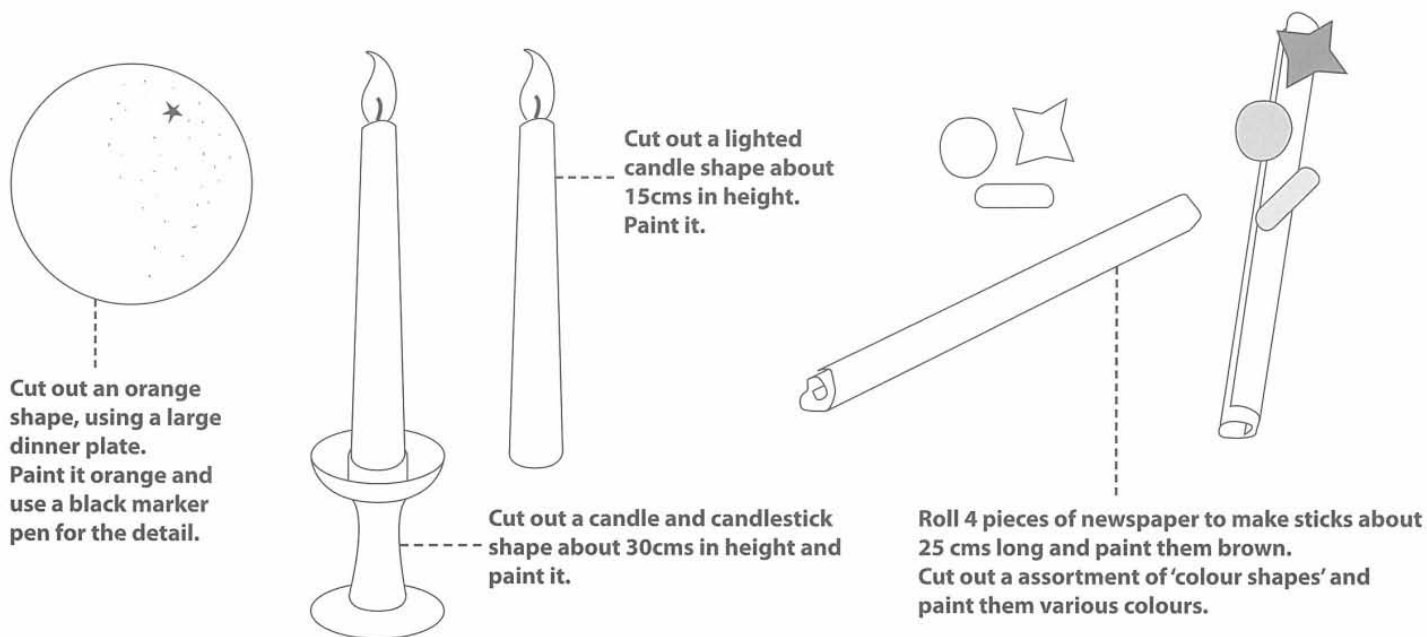




# TELLING THE CHRISTINGLE USING A STORY BOARD

## You will need :-

- A notice board with felt background or a piece of cardboard covered with felt.
- Painted cut out shapes as described below.
- Four 'sticks' made from rolled newspaper and painted brown
- A length of red ribbon
- Squares of Velcro to attach to each shape, as well as the "sticks".



## Telling the story:

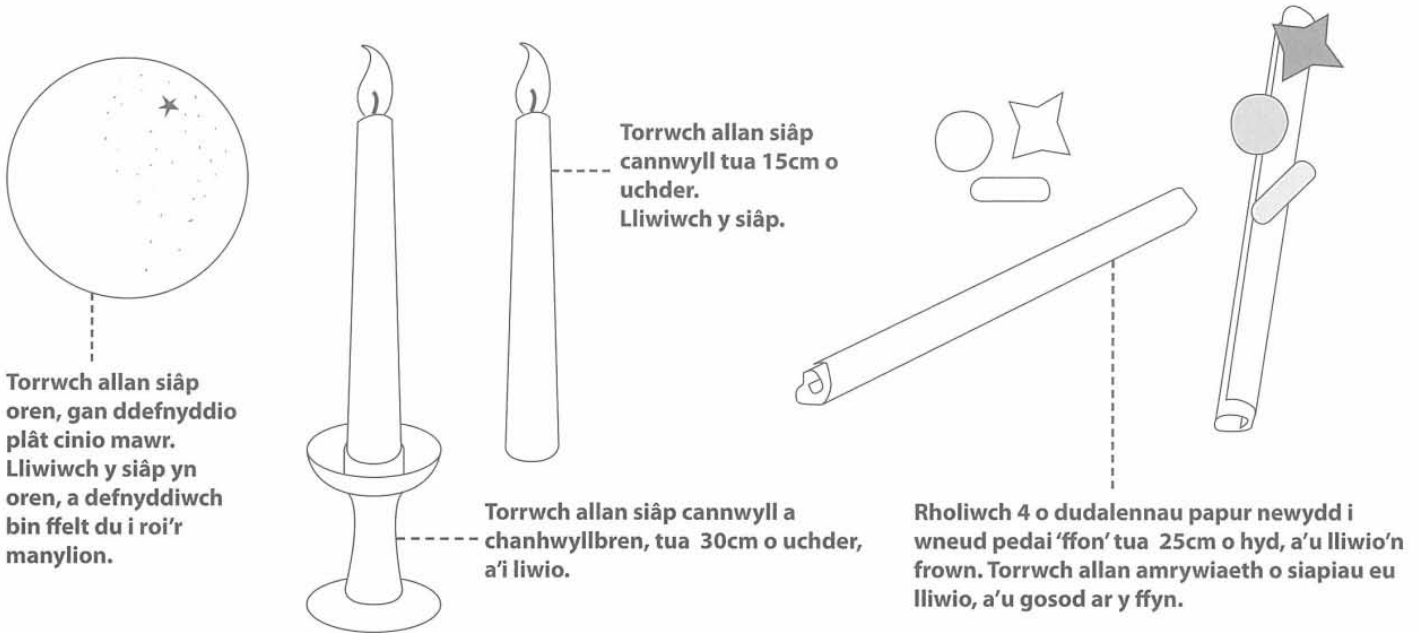
- Begin by asking the children for things that give us light.
- Introduce the theme of the Christingle as representing Jesus the Light of the World
- As you are doing this place the lighted candlestick shape onto the board as an example of a light giving object
- Hold up the large orange shape and explain that it is round like the world and stick it to the board.
- Hold up the sticks and explain that they represent the four seasons (name them) and the four corners of the earth ( name them) and that the sweets and fruit are from all over the world, God's gift to us.
- Place the sticks on the board so that they are sticking out of the orange
- Hold up the ribbon and explain that it represents Jesus' great sacrifice, that he came and died for us. This is red like the blood of Jesus. Jesus died for all people all over the world and the ribbon will go right around the orange to show this.
- Place the ribbon around the orange.
- Hold up the candle shape and explain that this is for Jesus, the Light of the world. Place the candle shape on to the top of the orange.
- Explain that the Christingle that you are to make / be given have all the same parts and all the same meaning.



# EGLURO'R CRISTINGL TRWY DDEFNYDDIO BWRDD STORI

## Fe fydd arnoch chi angen :-

- Hysbysfwrdd sydd â chefnidir ffelt, neu ddarn o gardfwrdd wedi'i orchuddio â ffelt.
- Siapiau wedi'u lliwio a'u torri allan, yn ôl y nodiadau sy'n dilyn.
- Pedair 'ffon' wedi'u gwneud o dudalennau papur newydd wedi'u rholio a'u paentio'n frown.
- Darn o ruban coch
- Sgwariau Velcro i'w glynu ar gefn pob siâp, ac ar y 'ffyn'.



## Dweud y stori:

- Dechreuwch trwy holi'r plant am y pethau sy'n rhoi goleuni i ni.
- Cyflwynwch thema'r Cristingl fel symbol o lesu, Goleuni'r Byd.
- Wrth i chi wneud hyn, gosodwch y siâp kannwyll oleuedig sydd mewn canhwyllbren ar un ochr i'r bwrdd ffelt, fel enghraifft o rywbeth sy'n rhoi goleuni i ni.
- Daliwch y siâp oren mawr i fyny, ac eglurwch fod yr oren yn grwn fel y ddaear, yna ei osod ar y bwrdd yn ymyl llun y gannwyll oleuedig.
- Daliwch y 'ffyn' i fyny, ac eglurwch fod y rhain yn cynrychioli'r pedwar tymor (enwch y tymhorau: gwanwyn, haf, hydref, gaeaf), ac yn cynrychioli pedwar cwr y byd (y pedwar cyfeiriad: gogledd, de, gorllewin, dwyrain). Eglurwch hefyd bod y melysion a'r ffrwythau sydd ar y ffyn yn dod o bob cwr o'r byd, a'u bod yn rhoddion i ni gan Dduw.
- Gosodwch y ffyn ar y bwrdd stori, fel eu bod yn ymwthio allan o'r oren.
- Daliwch y ruban coch i fyny, ac eglurwch fod y ruban yn cynrychioli'r aberth mawr a wnaeth lesu, sef dod i'r byd a marw drosom. Mae'r ruban yn goch yn cynrychioli gwaed lesu. Bu farw lesu dros holl bobl y byd, ac mae'r ruban yn mynd oddi amgylch yr oren i ddangos hyn.
- Gosodwch y ruban oddi amgylch yr oren.
- Daliwch y siâp kannwyll i fyny, ac eglurwch fod y gannwyll yn cynrychioli lesu, Goleuni'r byd. Gosodwch y siâp kannwyll ar ben yr oren.
- Eglurwch fod y Cristingl yr ydych yn mynd i'w wneud, neu ei dderbyn, yn cynnwys yr holl rannau hyn, a'r holl ystyr yn union.



# A DRAMATISED CHRISTINGLE

- Candle** One child in white t-shirt holding a large lighted candle.
- Orange** Four children dressed in orange t-shirts, holding a length of red florist ribbon.

- Fruits of the earth** Four children dressed in green t-shirts, each holding a large vegetable or fruit.
- Narrators** Two children dressed in white t-shirts.

This should be presented at a slow pace, with all participants moving slowly.

**CANDLE:** (*Stands "centre front"*) I am the candle. I remind you that Jesus is the Light of the World. Look at my bright light. It reaches out to everyone.

(*Moves slowly back to stand "centre stage" facing the congregation*)

**ORANGES:** (*Four children stand "centre" front*)

**ORANGE 1** We are the world that God created.

**ORANGE 2** We are the four corners of the world – north, south east and west.

(*A length of ribbon is slowly unrolled and held by the four "oranges"*).

**ORANGE 3** This red ribbon stands for forgiveness.

**ORANGE 4** The red ribbon reminds us that Jesus shed his blood on the cross so that we might be forgiven.

(*All four slowly move back, holding the ribbon, to form a circle around "candle" – at a safe distance – facing outwards so that the ribbon encircles them.*)

**FRUITS OF THE EARTH:** (*Four children dressed in green t-shirts stand "centre front"*.)

**F.O.E 1** We are the fruits of the earth.

**F.O.E 2** We remind you of the four seasons.

**F.O.E 3** Spring, summer, autumn, winter.

**F.O.E 4** We remind you how God gave us a wonderful world with plenty of food and all we need.

(*Move slowly back to form a circle around the oranges, facing outwards and stretching out their arms holding the fruits – cabbages, cauliflowers, broccoli*)

(*All stand in silence for a moment before two narrators enter*)

**NARRATORS:** (*Two children stand "left and right front"*)

**N. 1** This is the Christingle – the Christ light.

**N. 2** May Jesus, the Christ Child shine in our lives today.



## THE CHRISTINGLE ALPHABET

You will need large silver letters on card to spell out the word **CHRISTINGLE**. Children carry in the letters in the following order and say what each means:

**E is for the EMPEROR AUGUSTUS.** He was the ruler of the country. **Emperor Augustus** gave orders for everyone to go back to their home town to be counted by the Roman soldiers.

**N is for NAZARETH.** Joseph and Mary lived in **Nazareth** but Joseph's family came from Bethlehem. Mary and Joseph had to go Bethlehem to be counted. Mary was about to have a baby and it was a long hard journey.

**I is for INN.** When Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem it was full of visitors. All the **inns** were full up. There was no room for Joseph and Mary to stay anywhere and so they had to sleep in a stable.

**H is for HAY.** That night Jesus was born in the stable. Mary his mother dressed him in baby clothes and laid him to sleep on a bed of **hay**.

**S is for SHEPHERDS.** Some **shepherds** were out on the hills guarding their sheep. All at once, an angel came down to them from the Lord. The sky was filled with a bright light and the shepherds were really scared.

**T is for TELL.** The angel said, "Don't be afraid. I have come to **tell** you that the Saviour is born in Bethlehem. You will find him in stable, sleeping in a manger.

**G is for GOODWILL.** Then angels filled the sky praising God and singing about peace and **goodwill** on earth.

**R is for RAN.** The shepherds **ran** all the way down to Bethlehem to see the baby who had come to save the world.

**C is for CHRIST.** The shepherds saw the **Christ Child** lying on the bed of hay in the manger.

**L is for LIGHT.** Jesus was born as the **light** of the world. To bring the light of his goodness into our sad, dark world.

**I is for Immanuel.** The word **Immanuel** means "God is with us." God sent his Son Jesus down to earth to live like us. That is what we remember at Christmas.

Children move around and hold up the letters to spell out the word **CHRISTINGLE**.

One child says:

Our bright shiny letters remind us that the word **CHRISTINGLE** means **Christ light**. May the light of Jesus shine in our lives today.

**CANNWYLL:** (*yn sefyll ar y blaen yn y canol*) Fi yw'r gannwyll. Rydw i'n eich atgoffa chi mai Iesu yw Goleuni'r Byd. Edrychwch ar fy ngolau disglair. Mae'n ymestyn allan at bawb.

(*Yn symud yn ôl yn araf i'r cefn yn y canol gan ddal i wynebu'r gynulleidfa*)

**ORENNAU:** (*pedwar plentyn yn sefyll ar y blaen yn y canol*)

**OREN 1** Ni yw'r byd y mae Duw wedi'i greu.

**OREN 2** Ni yw pedwar cwr y byd - gogledd, de, dwyrain a gorllewin.

(*Mae'r strïbed rhuban yn cael ei ddadrolïo'n araf a'i ddal gan y pedwar 'oren'*)

**OREN 3** Mae'r rhuban coch yma'n cynrychioli maddeuant.

**OREN 4** Mae'r rhuban coch yn ein hatgoffa fod Iesu wedi colli ei waed ar y groes fel ein bod ni'n gallu cael maddeuant.

(*Mae'r pedwar yn symud yn ôl yn araf, gan ddal y rhuban, ac yn creu cylch o gwmpas y 'gannwyll' - yn ddigon pell o ran diogelwch - gan wynebu tuag allan a'r rhuban yn eu hamgylchynu.*)

**FFRWYTHAU'R DDAEAR:** (*Pedwar plentyn mewn crysau T gwyrdd, yn sefyll ar y blaen yn y canol.*)

**FF.1** Ni yw ffrwythau'r ddaear.

**FF.2** Rydyn ni'n eich atgoffa am y pedwar tymor.

**FF.3** Gwanwyn, haf, hydref, gaeaf.

**FF.4** Rydyn ni'n eich atgoffa fod Duw wedi rhoi byd rhyfeddol i ni, gyda digon o fwyd a phopeth rydyn ni ei angen

(*Mae'r pedwar yn symud yn ôl yn araf i greu cylch o gwmpas yr 'orennau', gan wynebu tuag allan yn ymestyn eu breichiau allan gan ddal y ffrwythau neu'r llysiau.*)

(*Pawb i sefyll mewn distawrwydd am ychydig eiliadau cyn i'r storiwyr ddod ymlaen*)

**STORIŴYR:** (*Dau blentyn yn sefyll ar y blaen, y naill ar y dde a'r llall ar y chwith*)

**ST.1** Dyma'r Cristingl - goleuni Crist

**ST.2** Bydded i Iesu, y Plentyn Crist, ddisgleirio yn ein bywydau heddiw.

**Ffrwythau'r ddaear** Pedwar plentyn mewn crysau T gwyrdd, yn dal llysiau neu ffrwythau mawr

**Storiwyr** Dau blentyn mewn crysau T gwyn.

## LLYTHRENNAU'R CRISTINGL

*Fe fydd arnoch chi angen llythrennau mawr arian, un ar bob cerdyn, i sillafu'r gair CRISTINGL. Fe fydd plentyn yn cario pob cerdyn yn y drefn yma, gan adrodd hyn am bob llythyren:*

**Mae G am GORCHYMYN.** Rhoddodd yr Ymerawdwr Awgwstws orchymyn i bawb yng Ngwlad Canaan fynd yn ôl i'r dref lle cawson nhw'u geni, er mwyn iddyn nhw gael eu cyfri gan y Milwyr Rhufeinig.

**Mae N am NASARETH.** Roedd Joseff a Mair yn byw yn Nasareth. Ond am fod teulu Joseff yn dod o Fethlehem, roedd yn rhaid i Mair a Joseff fynd yn ôl i Fethlehem i gael eu cyfri. Roedd Mair yn mynd i gael baban, ac roedd hi wedi blino.

**S sydd am STABL.** Doedd dim lle mewn un gwesty i Mair a Joseff aros. Roedd pob man yn llawn. Ac fe fu'n rhaid iddyn nhw aros mewn **stabl**.

**Mae I am IESU.** Cafodd Iesu ei eni y noson honno, a rhoddodd Mair ei baban bach i orwedd yn y preseb ar wely o wair.

**Mae R ar ddechrau'r gair RHEDEG.** Ac fe **redodd** y bugeiliaid yr holl ffordd i Fethlehem wedi i'r angylion ddweud wrthyn nhw fod baban bach arbennig iawn wedi'i eni yno.

**Mae T am TANGNEFEDD.** Roedd yr angylion yn moli Duw ac yn dweud "Gogoniant yn y goruchaf i Dduw, ac ar y ddaear **tangnefedd** i ddynion, sydd wrth ei fodd."

**Mae I am IMMANUEL.** Enw arall hefyd ar Iesu Grist yw **Immanuel**, sy'n golygu bod Duw gyda ni. Anfonodd Duw ei fab Iesu Grist i fyw ar y ddaear fel ni. Ac am hynny y byddwn ni'n cofio adeg y Nadolig.

# CHRISTINGLE COOKERY – STAR BISCUITS



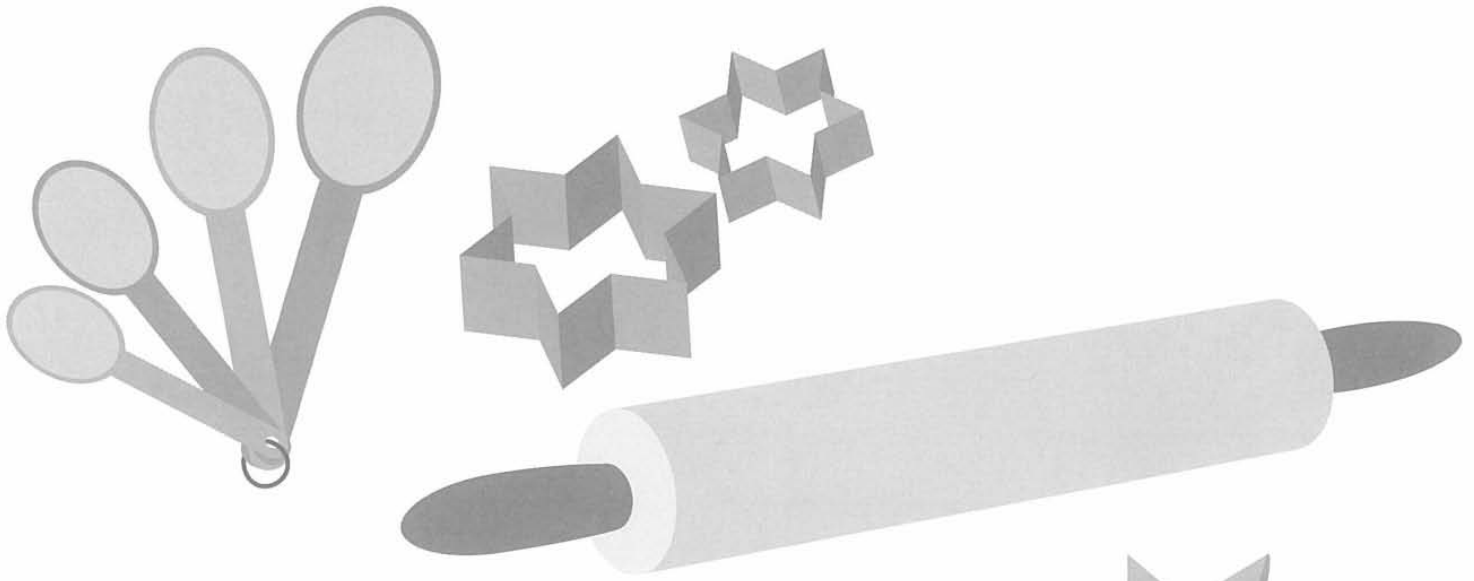
## Ingredients

- 1 egg
- 226g (8oz) butter or margarine (softened)
- 113g (4oz) sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- ½ level teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 1 dessertspoon milk
- 340g (12oz) plain flour

- Put everything except the flour into a large bowl. (save some butter to grease the tin.)
- Add flour and mix to a dough with your hands
- Wrap the dough in greaseproof paper and put in the fridge to cool for a while.
- Grease the baking tin with the left over pinch of butter or margarine
- Take out the dough and give each child a piece the size of a ping-pong ball. Pat on a well floured the board until it is about 7mm (1/4 inch) thick. Cut into a star shape and place on the baking tray.
- If you want to hang the star on a tree, make a small hole at the top of each star with your little finger.
- Bake for 12 minutes at 180°C (350°F) or Gas mark 4, until slightly browned.
- Remove from the oven and leave to cool.
- When cool, tie a piece of ribbon or thread through the hole. Wrap in cling film to keep fresh until ready to hang on the tree.

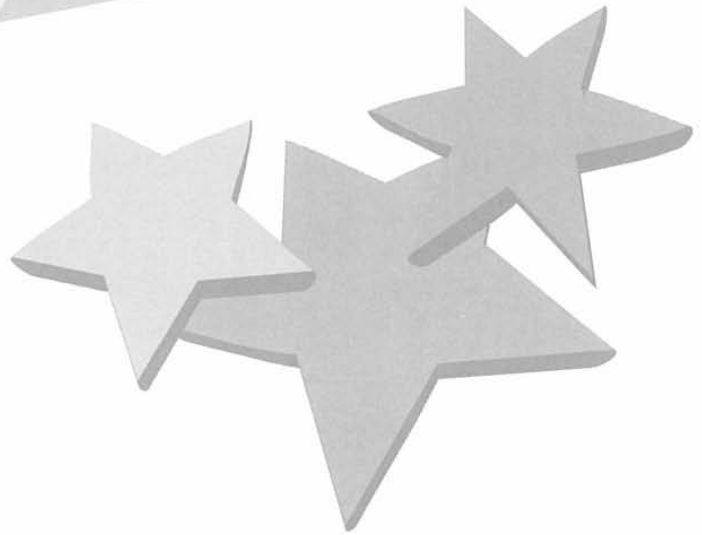

# CHRISTINGLE COOKERY – CANDLE CAKES

(Microwave recipe)

## Ingredients

175g (6oz) softened butter or margarine

1 beaten egg

175g (6oz) caster sugar

175g (6oz) flour

pinch salt



- Put butter, sugar, eggs, flour and a little milk into a mixing bowl and beat together with a wooden spoon. The mixture should gently drop of the end of your spoon.
- Spoon the mixture into paper cases and put onto a tray suitable for the microwave.
- Cook on HIGH (600-700 watts) until cakes are well risen and look slightly moist on the surface. Leave to stand for 5 minutes and leave to cool on a wire rack.
- Decorate the cakes when cold.

## To decorate

Either:

Use red and white fondant icing cut into candle shapes

Or:

Place a teaspoonful of white icing on each cake and decorate with a cherry or red, orange or yellow smartie on the end of the icing for a flame

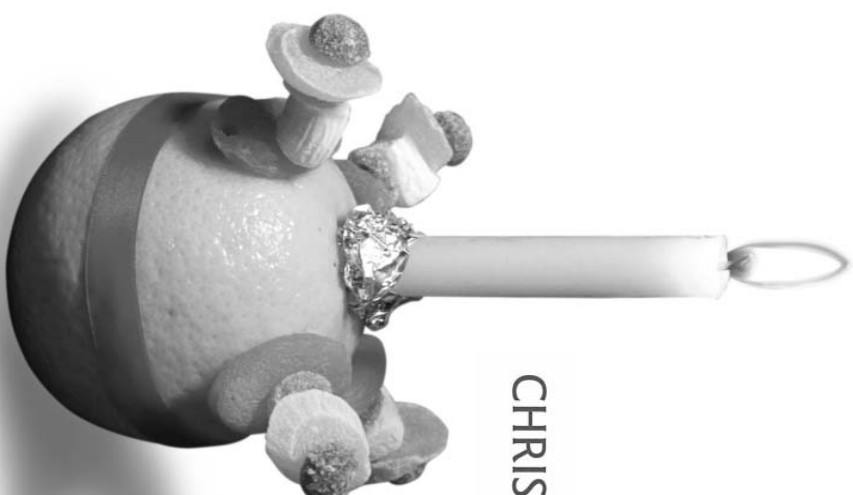
