Christian Aid Cymru are a charity that support people all over the world. Their aims are to stand together; for dignity, for equality and for justice.

They believe that everyone is equal in the sight of God but we live in a world where there is still poverty.

"Poverty is unfair and it stops people leading a full life but if we work together we have the power to help."

For over 70 years, Christian Aid have been standing with the poorest of our neighbours. They work in 37 countries, with people of all faiths and none, to stand up for dignity, equality and justice.

They want to work with others to create a world where everyone can live a full life, free from poverty.

"Our voices and actions are stronger together. And with everyone's help, they can make an even bigger difference."

One of the ways that we can think about helping in a practical way is by looking after our world. The impact of what we do or don't do everyday can be felt by many people all over the world. By making small changes we can contribute to a big change for everyone.

We can also make out voice heard so that people who make important decision in our community or county know what we are thinking and feeling.

Christian Aid can help us to think about and support others who may be affected by climate changes in a unfair way. We can also help them by raising money so that they can continue to help others.
